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Gloves for Caving:

I have tried almost every type of glove out there but the Ronstan Gloves have been the best glove that I have been able to find for caving and rope work.

I like these gloves because they are very hard wearing, and I personally prefer fingerless gloves.

They are specifically made for rigging on sailing boats, so they don't break down from UV rays or salt water.

I am seeing these gloves on canyoners and cavers more and more. They are available in both fingerless, as shown, or full finger, except for the index and middle fingers.

Photos 1 and 2 are my original pair, and they are over three years old, and have done at least forty canyons and caving trips, that's a trip almost every second weekend.

The main part of wear is in the inside wrist area. Photos 3 and 4 are the latest design of Ronstan gloves. They seem to be made pretty much the same, just with a new modern look.

Cost: \$25.00.

Where to buy: Any boating store should have them, although I buy them from Bias Boating.
